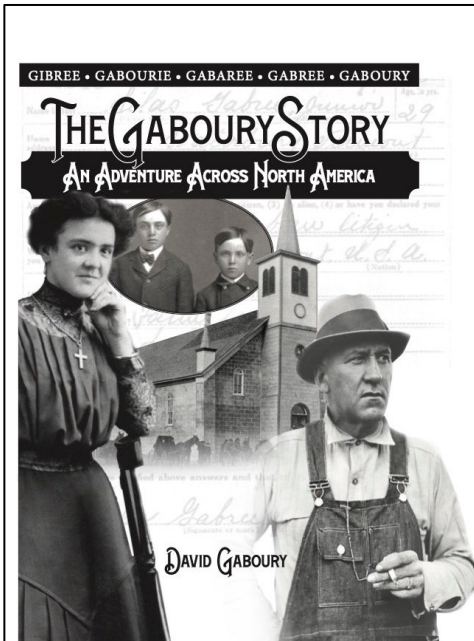


Meet the Gabourys!

In 1807, Marie-Anne Gaboury settled in the Winnipeg area with her husband, Jean-Baptiste Lagimodière. She was the first woman of European descent to settle in Western Canada, and their grandson, Louis Riel, became the father of Manitoba. More than 200 years later, Gabourys from across North America are in Winnipeg to celebrate a large family reunion and we are opening some of the events to the public. “The Gaboury Story, 360 years of Gaboury history in North America,” presented by researcher and author David Gaboury. After the first Gaboury arrived in Quebec in 1659, the family has spread across North America. Learn where they went, what factors drove them to those places, and how all the branches fit together.

“The Fur Trade Period in Western Canada” presented by noted historian Dr. Philippe Mailhot. He will talk about the fur trade in the early 1800s and how Jean-Baptiste Lagimodière and his wife Marie-Anne Gaboury played a part in it.

After the lecture there will be traditional Métis music and dancing performed by the Asham Stompers, followed by DJ music. It will be an educational and entertaining evening.
